
Jim Whitty's paintings continue to draw on landscape. He loves exploring, discovering secret, seldom visited places off the beaten track. He spends hours poring over maps, following the course of a river or coastline, or simply following his nose down a promising-looking lane. Such explorations keep fresh a natural wonder for the world around us that he has had since childhood, and provide the starting point for many of his paintings. These can be sparked by a photo, a memory, imagination, or even a dream, but often change completely during the painting process. Playing with paint is an ongoing experiment to explore new ways of creating illusion. Seemingly random marks can build with rhythm and scale to create a sense of space. The canvas moves between the wall and the floor, paint is put on taken off, thrown, splattered and glazed. Jim strives to make a work that through its simplicity becomes more absorbing; the eye can rest while the mind wanders. Colour is also important as it sets mood, and can be used to create space, while the use of simple colour fields can evoke a deep meditative quality. In some more recent paintings Jim has been trying to inject a more dreamlike quality, mashing in ambiguity and playing with context and imagery. These metaphorical images are not all resolved, and leave questions unanswered, just as a half-remembered dream does upon waking. His fascination with both water and trees continues, and they lend themselves well to creating dream-like spaces, not only because they are loaded with deep rooted mythology and stories, but because of their constantly shifting, immersive qualities. They have been fascinating mankind for thousands of years and will do so for thousands more. They are places of shelter and calm - but also real or imagined danger and mystery. A place to escape modern life and get lost, enveloped in nature. When the sunlight bounces across the waves, or dances through the new green leaves, it can create a truly restorative magic. It is this, in essence, that Jim is try





2. The Chameleons Dream oil on canvas 160 x 225 cm














6. Secret Places 8 oil on canvas 61 x 92 cm 7. Woods 1 oil on canvas 100 x 140 cm






8. Secret Places 5 oil on canvas 61 x 91 cm 9. Shallow Clouds oil on canvas 95 x 125 cm






10. Pallet 36 oil on canvas 30 x 40 cm




